A few highlights from this year include:



Caring for 54 children at the children's home in Raymond.

These children, who would otherwise be on the street or in very unstable and unsafe situations, receive food, clothing, medical care, and a safe and loving home at Kenbe Fem.



Operating two schools that educate and serve a daily hot meal to 450 children.

Children from all over the community come to our schools, where they receive an education and a daily hot and nutritious meal. For many, this is their only consistent meal.



Made it possible for a little girl to have life-saving surgery.

When Dilene faced a life-threatening medical emergency, we were able to send the money for her to have the needed surgery.



Gave 3,000 pounds of rice to food pantries in our community.

Thanks to First United Methodist Church, Pearland, and First Baptist Church providing funds and volunteers, we were able to give 3,000 pounds of rice to local food pantries.



Frantzo put on an eye clinic in Raymond and gave 150 pair of eye-glasses to people in the community.

Because of the glasses that we have been able to take to Haiti, Frantzo was able to do a vision clinic for the community.



Yonel and Manita are in the final semester of high school and are preparing for college.

The two children who we rescued from homelessness in the mountains twelve years ago are thriving and moving forward with their education.



We have received funding to repair the volunteer bunk houses and make them usable again.

For some time now, the volunteer bunkhouses that have provided a safe and welcoming space for over 1,000 volunteers, who came from around the country to serve in our communities have been unusable due to water damage. Last month, we received grant funding to repair them. The work is currently in progress, and we should be ready to take in volunteers again this spring!
